Conditions

This event will run under EA/FEI rules. The Organising Committee (OC) reserves the right to change or amend the program at their discretion. All owners and competitors will be personally responsible for damages to any third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. Please ensure the safety of your children whilst in proximity to horses.

Scratching / Refunds of Entries

Scratching's received before close of entries (5pm, 13th March 2020) or when classes are full, will receive a full refund of entry fees and stabling, less \$50 admin fee. • Scratching's after the close of entries (5pm, 13th March 2020) will receive a 50% refund of entry fees and stabling fees less the full \$50 admin fee, on presentation of a medical or veterinary certificate (certificates must be received by 5pm Monday 30th March). • After the commencement of competition (8am, 26th March 2020), there will be no refunds. Scratching's prior to 8am, 26th March 2020, will only be accepted by email to jumping@equestrianvictoria.com.au.

Starts per horse

Horses may only start in a maximum of 2 Classes per day.

Horses may only nominate in one title class, childrens, junior, young rider, senior. These horses may not start in the Mini Prix. Title horses are permitted to start in height classes and other classes as time permits.

Riders and Owners

All riders and owners in all classes must be current financial members of EA. Horses must hold current EA registration and licence except for those riding in classes 104cm and below

Dress Code

Riders in all competition rings must be in correct dress unless otherwise instructed by the judge. It is compulsory for athletes to wear a properly fastened helmet at all times whilst mounted. As an exception senior athletes may remove their helmet at the presentation in the competition arena only.

Presentations and prize money

Presentations will be mounted, and riders must wear their correct attire. Riders who are not available for presentations or who do not fulfill any media commitments that may be required by the OC, may forfeit all prize money. Winners of classes may be required to participate in photo and media obligations. Prize money in Title classes Childrens, Junior, Young Rider, Senior and large classes Stars of the Future, Mini Prix, Amateur and Speed will be Direct Debited within 14 days of event. All other classes will be given prize money at event.

Stallions

The Organising Committee follows the EA stallion code of conduct. Guardians of riders/handlers under 17 years must take responsibility for stallions at all times including when leading, riding or stabling stallions throughout the venue.

Dogs

Dogs must be kept on a leash and under effective control at all times. Dogs are not permitted in warm up or competition areas or in the indoor arenas.

Equestrian Victoria and the Organising Committee reserve the right to change or amend the program at their discretion.

1. Nomination Conditions for Children, Junior, Young Rider and Senior

How many starts

A rider may not ride more than three horses (if entries permit) in any one championship division but in the case of excessive entries, the OC reserve the right to restrict a rider to two starts.

Children, Junior, Young Rider, Senior are block entries. The top 30 children, top 30 juniors, top 20 young riders, top 20 senior horses will qualify for the FINAL. Horses not qualified for the final have the opportunity to participate in a consolation class as part of their block entry.

Competitors whose age allows them to compete in different divisions may do so but **only** if on different horses.

Children: An Athlete may compete in Children's classes until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 14 years old. Starting height in the first round for Children's classes is a maximum of 100cm

Junior: Athletes can take part in Competitions for Juniors until the end of the calendar year, in which they reach the age of 18 years. Athletes may take part in open Competitions 120cm and above from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 years.

Young Rider: Athletes may take part in Competitions and Championships for Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 21.

Senior Rider: Athletes are eligible to compete from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years

Scoring for State Championship Classes

Scoring will be done over 3 rounds to determine the Champion

Round 1 will be scored by total number of starts. i.e. if 30 horses start class then first place will receive 30 plus 1 point. 2nd place will receive 28 points, 3rd place will receive 27 points and so on down to last place who shall receive 1 point. Horses eliminated will receive 0 points.

Round 2 will regardless of numbers of horses starting use the same number from round 1 and the same scoring system, Round 1 and Round 2 will then be added together for a leaderboard.

Round 3 - the FINAL will be seeded from highest to lowest based on points from the leaderboard. Round 3 will be scored the same way as Round 1 and Round 2. 1st place would receive 30+1, 2nd place 28 points, 3rd place 27 points etc...points over the the 3 days will determine the State Champion.

The state champion will be awarded from placing on the leaderboard.

If competitors are tied for first place after the three final competitions, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a reduced course of at least six obstacles. In case of equality of penalties and time in this jump-off a second jump-off, against the clock, will be held over the same course. Competitors not in the jump-off but tying on penalties are placed equal.

2. Nomination conditions for Stars of the Future series

Stars of the Future is a block entry running over 3 days.

For Horses that are 6yrs, 7yrs or 8yrs from the date of birth at the time of competition, there is **no point restriction**.

Any Horse that has started in a World Cup Class cannot compete in any Future Stars, Futurity or Stars of the Futures classes.

Points will be awarded in Round 1 and Round 2 as per state championship classes to seed Round 3 (Final). The Final will run as a stand-alone class. The top 20 horses from both Round 1 and Round 2 will be invited to the final (i.e. 40 horses). Should a horse place top 20 twice the next placed horse from Round 2 will be invited to compete in the Final. For horses not making the final a consolation class will be offered.

3. Nomination conditions for Mini Prix series

Mini Prix is a block entry running over 3 days. Points will be awarded in Round 1 and Round 2 as per state championship classes to seed Round 3 (Final). The Final will run as a standalone class. The top 20 horses from both Round 1 and Round 2 will be invited to the final (i.e. 40 horses). Should a horse place top 20 twice the next placed horse from Round 2 will be invited to compete in the Final. For horses not making the final a consolation class will be offered.

Mini Prix horses may not start in Title series i.e. Senior, Young Rider, Junior but may start in stars of the future if eligible.

Starting Height: 135cm first round .

4. Nomination conditions for Amateur

Amateur is a block entry running over 3 days. Points will be awarded in Round 1 and Round 2 as per state championship classes to seed Round 3 (Final). The Final will run as a standalone class. The top 20 horses from both Round 1 and Round 2 will be invited to the final (i.e. 40 horses). Should a horse place top 20 twice the next placed horse from Round 2 will be invited to compete in the Final. For horses not making the final a consolation class will be offered.

Amateur Rider classes are classes for Athletes who:

Must not have competed in an Olympic Games or World Equestrian Games in either Jumping or Eventing. In the past 10 years must not have competed in a World Cup for Jumping Riders qualifying round or in a 4* 3 day event. Must not have competed in section 1 and 2 at a Royal Show in Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne, Adelaide or Perth in the past two years. Amateur Riders may not compete in an Amateur class if they compete in a class where the first round is higher than 120cm at that show. Amateur Riders may not compete in an Amateur class on a Horse that will compete in a class where the first round is higher than 1.20m.

Athletes may compete as amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 21 years of age.

5. Nomination conditions for Racing Victoria Off the Track Championship Series Final

Racing Victoria have sponsored a class at State Titles this will be a 110cm-120cm Championship. This is open to Thoroughbreds that are 4 years old and over, and who are registered with the RISA (Racing Information Services Australia). Registrations will be checked by the Organising Committee and provided to Racing Victoria. Racing Name and microchip number must be supplied at time of entry. There is no limit as to how long they have been out of racing. First two rounds will be 110cm, the final depending on the field may be raised but will not exceed 120cm. Points will be allocated for rounds 1 and 2 to enable seeding for the final. The final will run as a separate class. The top 20 horses from the leaderboard after Round 1 and Round 2 and the Top 5 combinations from the Equestrian Victoria Off The Track Jumping Series will be invited to the Final.

6. Nomination conditions for open height classes Gem Twist (90cm), Stroller (100cm), Hickstead (110cm), Milton

The four series height classes (Gem Twist, Stroller, Hickstead, Milton) will run each day over the 4 days of the show. Points will be allocated for horses competing in each round including round 4. All rounds will be placed as standalone classes. At the completion of Round 4 the Champion will be named overall in the class. This Champion will be determined from the combination that carries the highest number of points from all 4 events. i.e. round 1, round 2, round 3 and round 4. Champions in each height will receive a trophy rug and sash plus \$100 bonus. Horse and rider combinations may compete in 2 heights if scheduling allows remembering horses MAY not compete in more than 2 classes at the show each day.

Additional

The committee of the 2020 Victorian Jumping Titles has worked hard to try to absorb some of the costs of entering this event. This cost absorption includes initial bedding being covered, reduced facility fees, reduced campsite fees, no admin fee, no first aid fee. This is our way of giving back and saying thank you for coming to our show.

Stabling and Yards

Stabling can be booked with entries. Stabling will be charged at \$40 per night plus a compulsory levy for cleaning of \$30. Stable charges include all bedding to a max 1 square metre to be filled by riders from allocations at end of stable blocks. Extra bedding needed after this needs to be ordered from WPNEC. Stables will be allocated on a first in first serve basis with preference given to those stabling for the entire event. Rather than 1 night.

Riders staying through from DJWTS will need to pay a facility fee for each horse staying through. The committee have capped this to \$30 per horse. This is an extra charge ONLY for horses staying through. From Wednesday 25th you will need to rebook stables.

Yards will be charged at a fee of \$20 for the entire event whether staying for 1 night or 4 or for the day. Yards will be allocated and need to be booked at time of entry as yards will be reserved based on camping allocations. PLEASE NOTE: WPNEC DOES NOT allow build your own yards.

Camping and Power

All campsites offered will be powered. These will be at a one off charge of \$50 for the duration of the event regardless if staying for 1 night or 4.

Facility Fee

Each horse will attract a venue facility fee of \$30 per horse. This is a one off charge for the duration of the event regardless if on grounds for 1 day or 4

Day Stay

Riders coming in and out for the day will need to pay a one off charge of \$20 - this includes a YARD allocation. There is no need to book a yard separately. This is a one off charge for the duration of the event regardless of number of days competing. There are no horses allowed to be tied to floats or trucks when on the grounds at WPNEC.

VIP

Will be hosted on Saturday and Sunday with a scrumptious grazing table for luncheon but at a time that suits you, beer, wine and soft drink. Want to be pampered? Then join us for all the feature classes and mingle with our sponsors.

Coming with friends?

If you are travelling with friends and want to be stabled / yarded / camped together this must be noted on both sides entries at time of booking. No requests to be together will be acknowledged if both parties do not request the same. Whilst we endeavour to meet all requests we cannot promise this will be the case. We ask you to understand we will do our best to accommodate requests but some may just not be possible.

2. To be eligible to participate in this event you must be a current EV member or current member of an EA state branch. You must also satisfy any further membership or registration requirement (including those for any horse entered) referred to in the General Conditions of Entry for the event (Conditions of Entry) and individual disciplines.
3. The EA National Sports Rules applicable to the event are referred to in the Conditions of Entry.
4. All EA and EV events are subject to the EA Code of Conduct (Code of Conduct). Welfare of the Horse

In all equestrian sports the horse must be considered paramount.

The well being of the horse shall be taken above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organisers, sponsors or officials.

All handling and veterinary treatment must ensure the health and welfare of the horse.

The highest standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times.

Adequate provision must be made for ventilation, feeding, watering and maintaining a healthy environment during transportation.

Emphasis should be placed on increasing education in training and equestrian practices and on promoting scientific studies in equine health.

In the interests of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider shall be regarded as essential.

All riding and training methods must take account of the horse as a living entity and must not include any technique considered by the FEI/EA to be abusive.

National Federations should establish adequate controls in order that all persons and bodies under their jurisdiction respect the welfare of the horse.

The national and international Rules and Regulations in equestrian sport regarding the health and welfare of the horse must be adhered to not only during the national and international events, but also in the training.

Competition Rules and Regulations shall be continually reviewed to ensure such welfare.

Appendix 1

Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre Risk Management

1. Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre Committee of Management considers it a privilege that you are allowed to bring your dog to this venue. We insist you keep your dog under effective control at all times.
 2. Approved Safety Helmets must be worn at all times when riding
 3. Cross Country obstacles must not be jumped/used unless a non-riding level one coach is present.
 4. Riding of horses bareback is prohibited
 5. Riding of rugged and/or unbridled horses is prohibited
 6. Any person may lead a maximum of two horses while mounted
 7. Stallions must have an adult handler in the vicinity at all times
 8. Horses are not permitted within/upon the quadrangle (between the barn & Indoor 1)
 9. Horses are not permitted near pedestrian door ways
 10. Bicycles are not permitted in the Indoor Arenas or any stable block. Approved helmets must be worn at all times
 11. Bicycles are not permitted near doors designated as public entrances or exits
 12. Motor Cyclist riders must wear approved safety helmets and hold the appropriate licence
 13. Speed limits must be adhered to at all times, the speed limit at WPNEC is 10km p/h
 14. Power leads must not be on the ground or over roadways
 15. Construction of portable/tape yards is prohibited
 17. Please observe all signs at the venue
 18. Horses must be tied in a safe manner. Horses must not be tied to unattached floats, wheelie bins etc
 19. No infrastructure to be erected on WPNEC Grounds without written approval by management prior to event
 20. Entry and Exit doors to Indoors Arenas are not be obstructed at any time
 21. Every event to book at WPNEC must provide their own first aid officials
